


2017 Historic Houses of Morship Tour

SAINT MARKS LUTHERAN CHURCH

601 Washington Avenue Founded in1889 in the western Enterprise Firehouse on Washington Square, the church later moved onto the square with the first church building which was replaced with the present 1929 gothic Revival sanctuary. Features include a three manual Moller organ, a depiction of Christ ascending on the altar wall, German Paint decorations and pristine wood work.

Organ and piano will be played throughout the tour.

WASHINGTON SQUARE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

538 Washington Avenue Washington Square was a mission church started under St. Paul's Methodist Episcopal Church- the people met in an orchard beginning in 1885. A small chapel

was built in 1886. In 1888 the land was purchased and a wood frame church was built. The church building was dedicated in 1889.

First Baptist Church 3 First Bapusi C 15 High Street

First Baptist Church is the only church in Washington County that has had two presidents attend a worship service. President Lyndon B Johnson and President Jimmy Carter. The church belongs to the Southern Baptist Convention.

ST. JOHN'S EPISCOPAL CHURCH 4 101 S. Prospect Street

Neo-gothic in style, St. John's was built in 1872. Notable features include a high Gothic altar, the reredos, a wrought iron rood screen separating the sanctuary from the congregation and beautiful stained glass windows (one of which is a Tiffany). Holiday music will be presented during the tour. The church houses a 61 rank, 3499 pipe Moller organ including a newly installed Trompette en Chamade.



5 THE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH OF HAGERSTOWN


20 S. Prospect Street Founded on November 15, 1817 on Potomac Street, the church moved to Prospect Hill in 1872. Originally

constructed in the center pulpit and table

style, the sanctuary was renovated in 1949 into a split pulpit with raised communion table. The church also has a smaller Chapel, which is used weekly for worship services. During the tour, there will be a variety of music in the Sanctuary and a 200thAnniversary display of pictures, news articles and a variety of memorabilia in the Fellowship Hall.

THE MILLER HOUSE

6 THE MILLER HOUSE 135 W. Washington Street REFRESHMENTS SERVED HERE Built in 1825, the Miller House Museum serves as the headquarters of the Washington County Historical Society and a local history museum. The house exhibits period decor and furnishings, as well as



collections of pottery, silver, clocks, dolls and toys and Civil War and War of 1812 artifacts. The kinship Center, located in the basement, houses church records and other documents from the history of Hagerstown. Special holiday decorations created by county garden clubs enhance the current exhibits, and a selection of photographs from 2016 Historic Houses of Worship contest will be on display during the tour. Light refreshments will be provided.

SAINT MARY CATHOLIC CHURCH 7 SAINT Mashington Street 224 W. Washington Street

Beginning as a log chapel in the 1700s, St. Mary Catholic Church is known as the area's "Mother Church" to seven other Washington County Parishes. The cornerstone of the present building was laid on July 4, 1826 on the same site as the log cabin chapel. The great crucifix in the center of the sanctuary, circa 1870, was imported from Munich, Bavaria. In the early 1900's, six stained-glass windows with

jewel-like tones, were installed, depicting scenes from scripture. The three Breccia Violetta marble altars were imported from Ital and added during the 1961 renovation.

CONGREGATION B'NAI ABRAHAM

8 53 E. Baltimore Street Congregation B'Nai Abraham is a reform Jewish Congregation and the only synagogue in Hagerstown. It was founded in 1892 and has served as a loving, caring center of Jewish life in Western Maryland and surrounding areas ever since.

OTTERBEIN UNITED METHODIST CHURCH 9 108 E. Franklin Street

Otterbein was founded in 1790 as St. Paul's United Brethren in

Christ Church, originally meeting in a building on West Washington Street. Items of note include the reredos and stained glass windows. The current Moller pipe organ, recently digitally enhanced, was installed in 1969 to replace the original 1898 Moller. Look for the Zimbelstern-a star shaped "toy" stop which produces unique Baroque style overtones. Music and treats offered during the tour.

10 ZION REFORMED UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST 201 N. Potomac Street

The church first gathered in 1766, and Zion was

founded in 1770. During the Civil War, the bell tower was used as a sniper post by General Custer. The cemetery bears the remains of veterans from the Revolutionary War, French and Indian War, War of 1812, and our city's founder, Jonathan Hager. It has beautiful Tiffany Stained glass windows throughout. It is the oldest church building in Washington County and in 2016 this congregation celebrated its 250th year.

TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH

11 N. Potomac Street & Randolph Avenue Trinity's congregation was founded in 1859. The cornerstone for the present building was laid in 1909 and was completed and dedicated on March 19, 1911. It is built from granite from Port Deposit, Pa. The stained glass windows were added in 1948, and the sanctuary

windows tell the story of the Apostle's Creed. The baptismal font by Bertel Thorvaldsen weighs 3,000 pounds. The original Moeller organ was replaced by a Schantz and now has 56 ranks and 3,650 pipes. Refreshments will be served and seasonal music will be provided by organ. piano and harpsicord. There will also be a display of Nativity sets from around the world contributed by the congregation.

stained and painted glass side windows and the large rose window to the rear. A three manual, 43 rank Moller pipe organ is located behind the pulpit and contains 2,512 pipes.





SAINT JOHN'S EVANGELICAL 13 LUTHERAN CHURCH

141 S. Potomac Street Founded in 1770. St. John's is the oldest Lutheran Church in Hagerstown. The church is known for its soaring 134 foot steeple used for reconnaissance during the Civil War, it's three Tiffany stained glass windows and a restored 1931 four manual Moeller organ. Plenty of parking is available. Music on the Moller organ will be played throughout the tour.



ASBURY UNITED METHODIST CHURCH 155 Jonathan Street

Founded under the supervision of St Paul's United Methodist Church in 1818, the Asbury Congregation is the oldest

African American Church in Hagerstown. The Asbury Methodist Episcopal Church congregation built their first church on the present site in 1864. The church, rebuilt in 1879, was gutted by fire in 1973. The church bears a strong resemblance to the Ebenezer African Methodist Church's 1840 building.



CHRIST'S REFORMED CHURCH 15 130 W. Franklin Street

Christ's Reformed Church is an old historic German Reformed

church, formed in 1854. Notable architectural elements include the crown on the spire, the Rose Medallion window fronting Franklin Street and the Reredos behind the altar with it's representation of each of the 12 disciples. There will be seasonal music offered each hour on the hour.



12 JOHN WESLEY UNITED METHODIST CHURCH 129 N. Potomac Street Construction of this gable fronted Gothic

style limestone sanctuary, seating 540, was completed in 1885 at a cost of around \$50,000. Note the beautiful
